Transport Links



The Trust is located close to the East Coast of England, 220 miles north of London. We have two local airports - Humberside International Airport, which is a short drive from two of our hospital sites (Grimsby and Scunthorpe) and Doncaster Robin Hood Airport which is located between our Scunthorpe and Goole hospital sites. The M180/M62 motorways give easy access to the cities of Leeds, Sheffield and Manchester.



There is a ferry link to Europe a short distance away in Hull. A free shuttle service is available for staff between the Grimsby and Scunthorpe sites.



Public transport links are excellent with frequent buses running from the hospitals into the town centres on a frequent basis.

Grimsby

Grimsby offers you what no other town in the country can offer - a deep history, a great selection of shops, a most famous fishing heritage and much, much more. Grimsby lies on the South Bank of the Humber Estuary and is the 'capital' of North East Lincolnshire. Once famous for its fishing industry, Grimsby has carved a new identity in recent years and is currently poised for exciting developments as part of the local urban regeneration plans.

Cleethorpes

All the ingredients you expect of a traditional seaside resort are still alive in Cleethorpes. Four miles of safe award-winning sandy beaches, a superb events and festivals programme and a host of quality attractions and friendly accommodation.

The seaside town of Cleethorpes offers a multitude of attractions to suit many tastes. From donkey rides along the beach to the white-knuckle experiences at Pleasure Island theme park, Cleethorpes has it all. Nature lovers can stroll along the coastal path, watching the variety of wildlife that inhabits the shoreline - an area of natural beauty and one of Europe's most important estuarine wildlife havens.



Cleethorpes Beach

Cleethorpes seafront is a lively place to be, night or day. Visitors will find no shortage of places to eat and drink. The resort has many restaurants, cafes and pubs - from quiet and traditional to lively and modern and catering for a variety of tastes from real ale to trendy wine bars.

Scunthorpe

North Lincolnshire is an area of rural tranquility and remarkable natural beauty, where the rolling chalk of the Lincolnshire Wolds meets the lush Ancholme Valley and the unique Isle of Axholme. The past and present are never far apart and there are many attractions and places of interest within easy reach, linked by quiet country lanes and cycle routes. The vibrant town of Scunthorpe grew from five sleepy rural villages into one of the world's major steel producing centres. A Heritage Trail and steam train rides, tell the story of the great Victorian ironmasters.



Normanby Hall

Normanby Hall Country Park, with its award winning Victorian Walled Garden, is set in 300 acres of landscaped gardens with lakes and natural woodland. The Hall contains fine costume galleries and period rooms, with a Farming museum portraying rural life in North Lincolnshire. From the eerie and silent Thornton Abbey standing proud on the Wolds, to windmills, the ancient Alkborough turf maze and historic churches, North Lincolnshire is full of surprises.

Goole

With an historical museum, art gallery and waterways museum, Goole has a rich heritage and also has a prestigious RSPB nature reserve close by, Goole is also the UK's most inland port and as such has busy port traffic from various parts of the globe and is developing as an investment area for light industry public amenities and housing. Bus and rail links connect the town with Hull, Doncaster and Leeds and the nearby towns of Howden and Selby.

Children

If you have children, the Trust is a great place to work. There are a wealth of childcare options to choose from in the area including an on-site crèche at Grimsby and at Scunthorpe the local college offers Trust staff a discount for parents to use their crèche. Schools in the area have an excellent reputation from pre-school to sixth form college, technical colleges and the Lincoln University campus.

The seaside resort at Cleethorpes is fantastic for children – with a fun fair, beach front amusements, boating lake, bowling alley, large leisure centre and crazy golf – all within easy walking distance.

There are specialist children's play areas, children's farms, sports and dance classes and lots of other activities to keep the little ones (or big ones!) amused.

Sport

The area has a wide range of thriving sports clubs – rugby, football, athletics, fishing, cycling, swimming, squash, tennis, running, netball, bowls, sailing and cricket (including the Trust's very competitive cricket team!).

We have a number of excellent leisure centres, sports stadiums, gyms (many within walking distance of the hospital sites), dance studios and an ice rink at Grimsby.

There are centres specialising in hobbies such horse riding, gliding, sailing, parachuting and paintball.

Days Out

Within the towns of Scunthorpe, Grimsby and Cleethorpes there are a number of weekly markets with continental markets visting throughout the year. The market towns of nearby Brigg and Louth hold farmers markets each month and there are a number of excellent farm shops throughout the surrounding countryside.

Lincolnshire is fairly flat, so is ideal for hiking and cycling. We have this beautiful countryside surrounding all our hospital sites with many places to explore and eat out. Further afield, the ancient city of Lincoln is within a 30 minute drive (or train journey), as is the regenerating city of Hull, over the amazing Humber Bridge.



Entertainment

Cinemas, theatres, museums and galleries, this is an area rich in culture and places to visit.

Northern Lincolnshire and Goole Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust provides acute hospital services for around 440,000 people across the main population bases of Grimsby, Scunthorpe and Goole and the surrounding areas and also provides services for many Lincolnshire residents.
